Side-by-side with neighbors, families, and partners, we built more than houses: we built **unity** through shared purpose, **equity** by removing barriers, **legacy** through generational wealth, and **opportunity** for brighter futures. A community connected by action.

By bringing people together around a shared vision, we're building a stronger, more connected Kansas City. Because a future built by all of us is better for everyone.

Global Village

Uniting for Global Impact. Everyone deserves a safe, stable place to call home. Through Habitat for Humanity's Global Village program, we partner with communities around the world to build stronger futures.

Our first Global Village build was part of the 100,000 Floors to Play On initiative, focused on replacing dirt floors with concrete in homes where the need is greatest. Priority is given to households headed by women, with children under 6-years-old, older adults, or individuals with disabilities.
